What Should You Base Your Worth On

1. God's Standard of Worth for All People – True of ALL

- He saw His creation and He said it was GOOD (Genesis 1)
- We are all fearfully and wonderfully made (Psalm 139)
- All have innate value and deserve to be loved and respected.
- God doesn't make junk.

2. God's Creation of Individual Gifting – Uniquely True of YOU

- Your DNA is unique 8 BILLION People and ALL are one of a kind.
- Your fingerprints are unique
- The Iris of your eye is unique.
- God has a unique plan for your life. (Proverbs 3:5,6, Jer. 1:5)
- God gave you gifts and capabilities. No one has your unique set of abilities.

RELATIONAL TRUTH

- 1. Life is relationships. Good ones free you. Bad ones imprison you.
- 2. You are the sum total of those who have loved you or have refused to love you.
- 3. Life is relationships. From start to finish, birth to death, you can't duck the influence of *your* people.
- 4. Freedom begins with the courage to double check if your family of origin was "normal" or not.
- 5. Life is relationships and some spend their life trying to undo the impact of negative ones.
- 6. Overcoming your past is a far nobler path than denying it, repeating it or blaming others for it.

3. Twisted Declaration of Worth - Spoken as TRUE over You

- Your family of origin Your parents especially shape how you see yourself.
- People that you rely on are inadequate as parents/role models
- Parents are like a MIRROR They reflect to the young child who they are.
- Instead of being loved and encouraged, many are Ignored, rejected or abused.
- Either failed attachment or fractured attachment, self-doubt sets in.
- The dysfunction around you skews your view of who you are.
- Both harsh treatment and neglect erode the sense of worth God wants you to enjoy.
- Parents are to build into their children a clear picture of their worth before God.
- Parents are to display a consistent caring, encouraging disposition to each child.
- "For you know that we dealt with each of you as a father deals with his own children, encouraging, comforting and urging you to live lives worthy of God" 1 Thess. 2:11,12
